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Cultural Chameleon Night

Our families come from a broad spectrum of backgrounds. Some of our children were born abroad, others have strong cultural ties to other countries, some have spent time abroad and still others come from this country. This year on November 8th from 6-7:00 p.m. we will learn about our varied backgrounds and celebrate them when Carpenter presents a Cultural Chameleon Night! Join the fun by visiting cultural tables and learning about how the world has come together at Carpenter Elementary. In this module, students will use literacy skills to become experts-people who use reading, writing, and listening and speaking to build and share deep knowledge about a topic. Unit 1 Reading and Writing Narratives: Poems and Pourquoi Tales about Frogs. In this unit students will analyze poems to determine meaning, author's point of view, learn poetry form and terms (stanza, lines, tone, mood), identify figurative language (idioms, similes, metaphors), study the structure of the narrative form, plan and write a pourquoi tales that answer "why" questions, and identify and generate comparative and superlative adjectives.



Making Sense of Multiplication and Division: The focus of this unit of study is for students to build a conceptual understanding of multiplication and division. Students will use strategies to represent multiplication and division problems, apply strategies to solve and represent one and two step story problems involving addition, subtraction, and multiplication, use the distributive property, and solve an unknown factor problem.



Understand how events, individuals and ideas have influenced the history of local and regional communities. Explain key historical events that occurred in the local community and regions. Analyze the impact of contributions made by diverse historical figures. -Use historical thinking skills to understand the context of events, people and places. Explain change over time through historical narratives (events, people, places). Explain how multiple perspectives are portrayed through historical narratives. -Understand how diverse cultures are visible in local and regional communities. Compare languages, foods, and traditions of various groups.
